



Overview of Proposed Changes

Bylaw 2.10 – Cancellation of Registration or Membership

Who does this affect?

Changes to this bylaw affect those who have conditions on their practice permit and who do not comply with those conditions. It also affects members who do not comply with the Continuing Competence Program, as set out in the *Health Professions Act*.

What is the change and why is it being recommended?

It is recommended that this bylaw be amended to ensure that a regulated member's practice permit may be cancelled if the member has conditions imposed (typically when a member has not complied with requirements for registration or renewal) and does not comply with those conditions (meet the requirement) within a specified time.

Bylaw 3.1 – Reinstatement of Registration – Regulated Members

Who does this affect?

Changes to this bylaw affect those who had their registration cancelled under the *Health Professions Act*, except for under Part 4 of the Act (Professional Conduct).

What is the change and why is it being recommended?

It is recommended that this bylaw be amended to ensure that reinstatement requirements include consideration of the character and reputation of the individual at the time of their reinstatement, as well as considerations for individuals who have outstanding Hearing Tribunal decisions.

Members' Forum to Replace the Annual General Meeting (AGM) Requirement

Who does this affect?

This bylaw affects all ACSLPA members.

Why is the change being recommended?

ACSLPA's AGM has traditionally been a one-way communication from Council/staff to members. Members have provided feedback indicating the formal structure of the conventional AGM has not been of high value. Members have indicated that they are interested in being engaged with the College in more meaningful ways.

The replacement of the AGM with a Members' Forum will enable ACSLPA to serve its members better, improve two-way communication between members and the College and will enable members to share their thoughts and ideas readily with the Council and staff. A Members' Forum will further enable meaningful conversations and networking opportunities between members. The format of a Forum can be adjusted as needed depending on the needs of the members and relevant issues faced by members.

What is the change being recommended?

It is recommended that a Members' Forum be established in ACSLPA policy to occur at least annually in conjunction with the ACSLPA conference and that the requirement for an Annual General Meeting be removed from the Bylaws. In addition, the related sections of the bylaws that speak to the AGM will be revised to reflect the removal of the AGM. These sections are: 9.4.1, 9.8, 9.9, 9.10 and 9.11.
